Bachelor of Science in Health Education (Community Health Promotion Specialization)

Prepares students with a primary interest in community and public health education, or worksite health promotion. The CHP specialization is also appropriate for students planning to pursue graduate programs in health education or related fields (public health, health administration, and epidemiology and disease prevention). This specialization is also appropriate for students planning to pursue pre-health professional programs such as Nursing or Occupational Therapy.

Bachelor of Science in Health Education (Health Studies Specialization)

Prepares students who want in-depth knowledge of diverse health topics, with the intention to complete post-baccalaureate coursework in a professional health program. This specialization allows students to gain knowledge on a variety of health issues plaguing diverse population groups, while also providing the opportunity for students to complete required prerequisite coursework for professional health programs. This specialization is geared towards pre-health professional programs such as medicine, dentistry, optometry, pharmacy, physician assistant, occupational therapy, and physical therapy.
